Please participate in the Straw Poll!

October 31 through November 14

On May 31, 2016, the Session of Narberth Presbyterian Church voted unanimously and wholeheartedly to seek gracious dismissal, with property, from the Presbyterian Church (USA) to ECO: A Covenant Order of Evangelical Presbyterians, if the way be clear.

Since that time, Elders have been meeting with members and friends through individual meetings, small groups, and four Town Hall meetings.

As we pray about the next step, we are eager to hear from you through a Straw Poll. We are asking: do you sense that God is leading you, in the same way that He has led Session, to believe that ECO provides the best future for Narberth Presbyterian Church?

Some questions & answers:

What is a Straw Poll?

A straw poll is an unofficial ballot conducted to hear your view.

Are my answers confidential?

Yes. This poll is administered by an independent firm, Survey & Ballot Systems of Minneapolis; your responses are anonymous and confidential. NPC will not know how, or if, you responded.

Who can participate?

Participation is by written invitation to members and regular attenders (people who have signed into the Friendship Pad six or more times from January through September 2016). Those individuals will receive a letter in the mail this week with instructions on how to participate, which may be done online or by mail.

How will the results of the Straw Poll be used?

The Session plans to meet late in November to discern "if the way be clear." The Elders will consider all available information including: small group listening sessions, individual meetings, the Town Hall meetings and the results of the Straw Poll. Session will report back to the congregation shortly thereafter.

TESTIMONIES OF ELDER/DEACON NOMINEES

For Elder: Charlene Chen McGrew

The gospel came to my family through my grandmother, who as an orphan in China was raised by Christian missionaries. I was taught the gospel as a child: I was a sinner, Jesus Christ, God made flesh, took my sin on him, and died in my place so that I could be free. I knew it, but I had never counted on it until I was in college. I then recognized my need for grace and found my value as God's creation and daughter. I was baptized at Peninsula Bible Church in Cupertino, a community full of grace and insightful teaching. I am grateful that God has continued to show me Himself through my personal relationships and professional work. If confirmed as an elder, my prayer will be for wisdom and grace as I take on this role at NPC where we have worshipped and lived in community for the past 7 years.

For Elder: Michael Morrison

I grew up attending a Presbyterian church in Harrisburg, PA. Despite this upbringing and godly grandparents, I still went all the way through high school thinking of myself as a Christian despite skepticism about the validity of the resurrection (not a clue). In my freshman year of college I dated a girl who truly knew Christ as her Lord and Savior and put Him before me. This surprised me and challenged me to look more closely at my beliefs and face my insecurities concerning life ahead. At a Christian retreat over the New Year's weekend of 1975/76 I faced my spiritual reality and accepted Christ as my Lord and Savior. Since my return to walking by faith subsequent to my father's death in 1983, I have (with varying success) committed to letting God's Word guide my life and relationships.
