# INTRODUCTION TO ACTS

Today we begin a congregational journey through the Book of Acts, called “Acts 29.” It is not all “mapped out” yet, as we are seeking to be open to the Holy Spirit’s direction, but here are some guidelines so far:

- We are calling our journey “Acts 29”, because while there are only 28 chapters in the Book of Acts, God is on the move, writing new chapters through ordinary people like us.
- As Christ’s body on earth, we as the church are invited to share in his Great Commission.
- Since we cannot cover every verse in the Book of Acts, Sunday morning messages will highlight major passages which capture the heart of Christian discipleship and mission, and God’s purpose for our lives.
- Everyone is encouraged to read a chapter of Acts each day, to understand the grand sweep of the message, and also to meditate more deeply on the specific verses that will be preached on the following Sunday.
- If your small group would like to study the Book of Acts this year, we are pulling together resources that you can use, or you can simply study the scripture passage from the previous Sunday and use some of the application questions we plan to provide each week. (see page 14)

## Assignment for this week:

- Monday through Friday, read Acts 1-5, one chapter per day.
- Saturday, or any days you are led, meditate more deeply on next week’s passage, Acts 1:8, just one verse!  
Sermon: “Where’s The Power – What’s The Power?”

## Guidelines for reading Acts:

"The key to your reading of Acts is to recognize the "movement" of the gospel from Jerusalem to Rome, narrated in six parts (panels) and signaled by Luke's little summary statements in 6:7; 9:31; 12:24; 16:5; and 19:20. In each case the narrative seems to pause for a moment before it takes off in a new direction - sometimes geographically, sometimes ethnically, and sometimes both." (Gordon Fee, How To Read The Bible Book By Book).

Luke wants us to read Acts as "a play in which we are invited to become actors ourselves. The stage opens up and we discover we're in the middle of the action. That is part of the point of the "ending", which isn't really an ending: the story continues, and we are part of it." Acts 29! "It is a play in which the only true acting is what happens when the spirit of the playwright himself takes charge." (NT Wright, Bible Study Guide on Acts and Acts For Everyone).

# ACTS 1

**Acts 1:1-8** In my former book, Theophilus, I wrote about all that Jesus began to do and to teach <sup>2</sup>until the day he was taken up to heaven, after giving instructions through the Holy Spirit to the apostles he had chosen. <sup>3</sup>After his suffering, he presented himself to them and gave many convincing proofs that he was alive. He appeared to them over a period of forty days and spoke about the kingdom of God. <sup>4</sup>On one occasion, while he was eating with them, he gave them this command: "Do not leave Jerusalem, but wait for the gift my Father promised, which you have heard me speak about. <sup>5</sup>For John baptized with water, but in a few days you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit." <sup>6</sup>Then they gathered around him and asked him, "Lord, are you at this time going to restore the kingdom to Israel?" <sup>7</sup>He said to them: "It is not for you to know the times or dates the Father has set by his own authority. <sup>8</sup>But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth."

## Application Questions - for individuals or small groups:

In Acts 1:1, what is the significance of the word "began"? If Luke's gospel (volume I) is about "what Jesus began to do and to teach", how is that work "continued?" In Acts? In us? Do you frequently think of the church and yourself as partners with God?

In Acts 1:3, Jesus presented himself and "gave many convincing proofs that he was alive." What were these "proofs" for the apostles? What "proofs" have enabled you to believe in the resurrection of Jesus? What questions or doubts do you have about the resurrection?

In Acts 1:4 (and Luke 24:49) the apostles were instructed to "wait" for the promise of the Holy Spirit. In a book entitled, "Acts", what is the connection between waiting and working, prayer and action? How does this dynamic duo play out in your life? Which word is God speaking to you now?

In Acts 1:6,7, the apostles are still hoping for a kingdom that is especially for "them." How does Jesus correct them in Acts 1:8? How might these words of Jesus speak to us in the midst of our social, cultural, and political divisions? How are we as the church called to be a different voice and presence in this world?

If Acts 1:1-8 is a story in which we are actors, what is Jesus saying to you in particular, how is he directing you in your role?
