Then during the final hymn or after the service is completed, if you would be willing to pray every day this week for someone's prayer request, please come to the front, pick up a card at "random", and faithfully lift that person to the Lord in prayer. Next week, either at church, or in some other way, try to reach out to the person and let them know you prayed for them. Oftentimes, amazing new connections are made, we experience the body of Christ in action, and prayers are answered!

Prayer for Healing (Pastor Steve's Office)

Sunday mornings, 10:15-10:45am, prayer for healing is offered in a confidential, quiet and welcoming environment.

Assignment for this week:

- Monday through Friday, read one chapter per day in the Book of Acts.
- Saturday, or any days you are led, meditate more deeply on next week's passage: Acts 2:1-41
Sermon: "Pentecostal Presbyterians?"

Guidelines for reading Acts:

"The key to your reading of Acts is to recognize the "movement" of the gospel from Jerusalem to Rome, narrated in six parts (panels) and signaled by Luke's little summary statements in 6:7; 9:31; 12:24; 16:5; and 19:20. In each case the narrative seems to pause for a moment before it takes off in a new direction - sometimes geographically, sometimes ethnically, and sometimes both." (Gordon Fee, How To Read The Bible Book By Book).

Luke wants us to read Acts as "a play in which we are invited to become actors ourselves. The stage opens up and we discover we're in the middle of the action. That is part of the point of the "ending", which isn't really an ending: the story continues, and we are part of it." Acts 29! "It is a play in which the only true acting is what happens when the spirit of the playwright himself takes charge." (NT Wright, Bible Study Guide on Acts and Acts For Everyone).

ACTS 1

Acts 1:9-14 After he said this, he was taken up before their very eyes, and a cloud hid him from their sight.

¹⁰ They were looking intently up into the sky as he was going, when suddenly two men dressed in white stood beside them. ¹¹ “Men of Galilee,” they said, “why do you stand here looking into the sky? This same Jesus, who has been taken from you into heaven, will come back in the same way you have seen him go into heaven.”

¹² Then the apostles returned to Jerusalem from the hill called the Mount of Olives, a Sabbath day’s walk from the city. ¹³ When they arrived, they went upstairs to the room where they were staying. Those present were Peter, John, James and Andrew; Philip and Thomas, Bartholomew and Matthew; James son of Alphaeus and Simon the Zealot, and Judas son of James. ¹⁴ They all joined together constantly in prayer, along with the women and Mary the mother of Jesus, and with his brothers.

Application Questions - for individuals or small groups:

What does it mean that Jesus ascended to heaven? (Acts 2:32,33; Romans 8:33,34; Hebrews 1:3,4; Ephesians 1:18-23). What does the ascension mean for Jesus? For us?

How do you understand the angels' ("two men") gentle rebuke to the disciples in verses 10,11? Do you see any applications to your life?

What do you notice about the composition of the people gathered awaiting the promised Holy Spirit? What "composition" of a local church do you think is pleasing to God?

From Acts 1:12-14, 2:17,18, 4:13, and 1Corinthians 1:26-29, what kind of people does God use? Are you encouraged by this?

Between the end of Jesus' resurrection appearances (40 days) and the coming of the Spirit at Pentecost (50th day), there were 10 days of waiting for the Holy Spirit. What do you think happened in those 10 days? What did it look like?

Can you recall a time you experienced a breakthrough after an intense time of waiting on God? What is the value of a preparation or "wait training" time?

Acts 1:14 says that these 120 believers (Acts 1:15) joined together constantly in prayer, and some versions say, "in one mind", or "one accord." What is remarkable about this group's unity? Why is unity so important in a local church community? How is unity fostered? Since unity is not uniformity or sameness, how does unity work together with diversity?

What is the relationship between prayer and the outpouring of the Holy Spirit? Have you ever experienced a connection between the two? How so? What are the best experiences you've had in praying with others or in the company of others? What challenges?

If God were to move with new power in your life, what steps would God ask you to take in order to be "prepared?"
