## ACTS 2

Acts 2:41-47 Those who accepted his message were baptized, and about three thousand were added to their number that day.

<sup>42</sup>They devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and to fellowship, to the breaking of bread and to prayer. <sup>43</sup> Everyone was filled with awe at the many wonders and signs performed by the apostles. <sup>44</sup> All the believers were together and had everything in common. <sup>45</sup> They sold property and possessions to give to anyone who had need. <sup>46</sup> Every day they continued to meet together in the temple courts. They broke bread in their homes and ate together with glad and sincere hearts, <sup>47</sup> praising God and enjoying the favor of all the people. And the Lord added to their number daily those who were being saved.

### Application Questions – for individuals or small groups:

- If verse 47 is like the "punchline" of Acts 2:41-47, what is the connection between verses 47 and the previous description of the early church? Or stated differently, why do churches grow or not grow?
- From verse 47, what does it mean that the church had "favor", and who are "all the people?"
- How would you describe the relationship between the church and the surrounding community? How do we hold to the truth of the gospel and also have favor with the community? How do we navigate the tension between those two goals? (Romans 12:2; John 17:15-19).
- What does it mean to be "saved?" Is this part of your Christian vocabulary? What non-religious synonym or metaphor would you use to describe being "saved?" If someone asks you, "Are you saved?" What do you say in response?
- How would you correct these two statements in a more fully biblical direction:
  - "the saving of souls"
  - "I'm saved", that is, "I'm going to heaven when I die."
- In verse 47, what are the implications of each phrase:
  - The LORD added
  - To their NUMBER
  - DAILY
  - Those who were BEING SAVED
- How could verse 47 be fulfilled in our day? What actions might God be calling us to take? How do you see yourself participating in the great commission? (Matthew 28:19).
