Some of my earliest and most pleasant memories are of attending church with my mom. When I was a sophomore in college, my mom was diagnosed with cancer and died two months later. During her illness, I prayed and asked God for a miracle. When a miracle didn't happen, my faith was shaken and I drifted away from church and God. I dealt with my pain by throwing myself into my schoolwork and all the distractions of world. In 2001, my husband and I were expecting our first child. I believed the arrival of our baby would finally fill the emptiness and heal my heart. When Alexander was born, he was premature and had a very rare genetic abnormality. Sadly, he passed away when he was four months old. This time I knew there was no other way: either God was going to see me through my grief or I would drown in it. I called out to Christ. I asked God to lead me out of desperation and darkness. For the first time in a long time, I felt that I heard His answer. God helped me to forgive those who I believed contributed to Alex's death and gave me the faith to start our family again. I came to have a deep peace that my mom and Alex were safe and healed with our Heavenly Father. I know none of that would have been possible without Jesus. For the first time in my life, I understood John 16:33 and I realized that while this life may be filled with trials and sorrows, Jesus has overcome all our pain. I feel so blessed that during this time, I found NPC where my faith has continued to grow and be strengthened. I look forward to using my experiences to serve the church as an Elder.

#### Sue Wenger

I was called by God's grace to a personal relationship with Jesus Christ as a freshman in college through the ministry of Campus Crusade for Christ (now CRU). In my twenties, I grew in my faith especially through small group Bible studies and as a leader with Young Life in Colorado and a youth ministry in Germany. We are very thankful for your financial participation with NPC. Your gifts allow our ministry to flourish, helping us to reach out and support missions locally and around the world, teach our children and youth, and maintain our church building.

Through September, our offerings are \$12,656 ahead of last years' pace, and just \$9,687 below budgeted pace. To reach our 2017 budget of \$1,161,000, \$408,687 (or about 35% of budget) is needed in the fourth quarter.

Spending year to date has been below budgeted pace overall (by \$52,003) and we expect to end the year spending below budget in our budgeted categories. The net year to date shortage of \$67,172 has been funded by cash on hand and our endowment.

Outside of the budgeted areas shown above, there have been \$33,796 of expenses to complete various projects around the building (funded by a special gift), and \$11, 517 for Housing Support Program payments for non-ordained pastoral staff, plus \$51,526 of other expenses, primarily related to the ECO transition, funded by our endowment.

We ask for your continued support of our ministry to help bring us closer to our budgeted needs over the coming months, so we may fulfill God's purpose for NPC of building disciples in the love of Jesus Christ as we grow up in worship, grow together in community, and grow out in witness and service. Thank you!

# ACTS 3

# Acts 3:1-10

One day Peter and John were going up to the temple at the time of prayer—at three in the afternoon. <sup>2</sup> Now a man who was lame from birth was being carried to the temple gate called Beautiful, where he was put every day to beg from those going into the temple courts. <sup>3</sup> When he saw Peter and John about to enter, he asked them for money. <sup>4</sup> Peter looked straight at him, as did John. Then Peter said, "Look at us!" <sup>5</sup> So the man gave them his attention, expecting to get something from them.

<sup>6</sup>Then Peter said, "Silver or gold I do not have, but what I do have I give you. In the name of Jesus Christ of Nazareth, walk." <sup>7</sup>Taking him by the right hand, he helped him up, and instantly the man's feet and ankles became strong. <sup>8</sup>He jumped to his feet and began to walk. Then he went with them into the temple courts, walking and jumping, and praising God. <sup>9</sup>When all the people saw him walking and praising God,<sup>10</sup> they recognized him as the same man who used to sit begging at the temple gate called Beautiful, and they were filled with wonder and amazement at what had happened to him.

#### Application Questions - for individuals or small groups:

- In this passage, Peter and John were on their way to an "appointed" time of prayer. How does their openness to an "interruption" speak to you or challenge you? What are the greatest impediments in your availability to the Holy Spirit, to people?
- In this story, the lame man did not get what he wanted (or asked for), but he got what he needed, which was much better. Can you think of an example from your own life? Compare this line from a great hymn, "Hast thou not seen how thy desires have been granted in what He ordaineth?"
- Peter's prayer for the lame man's healing was a bold expression of great faith, more a command than a petition. Where did Simon Peter get this faith? (Acts 3:12,16; 4:8,13). How can we increase our faith in praying for others?
- On the basis of this passage and others in the Bible, what is your response to sickness in yourself or others? Do you pray emphatically for healing as Peter did? Why or why not? How can the local church today continue the healing ministry of Jesus Christ?
- In Acts 3:6, Simon Peter did not worry about what he didn't have, he gave what he did have. How does this encourage you and challenge you in the use of your gifts? What holds you back from using your gifts? Where do you sense God is prodding you to risk more in the use of your gifts?
- How are we as Christians and the church to respond to the "beggars" in our own world?
- The miraculous healing of the lame man was immediately followed by Peter's preaching of the gospel. What does this say about the holistic nature of the gospel? How do we strike the balance between word and deed, between acts of mercy and justice, and evangelism?
