I came to have a deep peace that my mom and Alex were safe and healed with our Heavenly Father. I know none of that would have been possible without Jesus. For the first time in my life, I understood John 16:33 and I realized that while this life may be filled with trials and sorrows, Jesus has overcome all our pain. I feel so blessed that during this time, I found NPC where my faith has continued to grow and be strengthened. I look forward to using my experiences to serve the church as an Elder.

ACTS 4

Acts 4:23-31

On their release, Peter and John went back to their own people and reported all that the chief priests and the elders had said to them.²⁴ When they heard this, they raised their voices together in prayer to God. “Sovereign Lord,” they said, “you made the heavens and the earth and the sea, and everything in them. ²⁵ You spoke by the Holy Spirit through the mouth of your servant, our father David:

“Why do the nations rage and the peoples plot in vain? ²⁶ The kings of the earth rise up and the rulers band together against the Lord and against his anointed one.’

²⁷ Indeed Herod and Pontius Pilate met together with the Gentiles and the people of Israel in this city to conspire against your holy servant Jesus, whom you anointed. ²⁸ They did what your power and will had decided beforehand should happen. ²⁹ Now, Lord, consider their threats and enable your servants to speak your word with great boldness.³⁰ Stretch out your hand to heal and perform signs and wonders through the name of your holy servant Jesus.”

³¹ After they prayed, the place where they were meeting was shaken. And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and spoke the word of God boldly.

Application Questions – for individuals or small groups:

- Peter is described as being filled with the Spirit in Acts 2:4; 4:8,31, implying that while we are permanently indwelt by the Spirit through faith in Christ (Romans 8:9; Eph. 1:13,14), there are many fillings (Eph. 5:18).
Q: When have you found that you need to be filled with the Spirit?
- Acts 3-4 mark the beginnings of opposition to the early Christians and the proclamation of the gospel. Paul refers to the Christian life as a “good fight” (2Tim. 4:7).
Q: Do you often think of the Christian life as a “fight”? Why would it be called a “good” fight?
- When the apostles boldly preached the gospel and faced opposition, their first instinct was to re-join the Christian community.
Q: When you face adversity, do you have a place to “go”? A church community, large or small, a friend to whom you can turn?
- In Acts 4:24-26, the prayers of the early church were shaped by the doctrine of creation and an understanding of Scripture from Psalm 2.
Q: How does the use of Scripture and prayer work together with mutual reinforcement? (Ps. 119:18; John 15:7)
Q: How does the use of Scripture affect the way you pray?
- What do you learn about prayer from Acts 4:29-31? How does this encourage or challenge your own prayer requests?
- In Acts 4:12, Peter preaches salvation in the name of Jesus Christ alone, reflecting Jesus’ own statement in John 14:6. How do you respond to questions or criticisms about the Christian faith or Christians being exclusive, narrow, or even bigoted?
