11:00 am - Hebrews: How Jesus was Deeply Jewish, and So is Christianity

John Chaffee will be leading a Zoom class for people of all ages (youth and all the way up) on the book of Hebrews. In the New Testament, Hebrews is an often overlooked book that is rich with Old Testament references and imagery. As a follow-up to Mark Wenger's course on Romans, Hebrews makes a lot of sense, because together, these books present different angles on the same Jesus and Christian faith. At a time in the first century when believers were experiencing a lot of push-back/harassment for their faith, and some were tempted to leave it, and return to traditional Judaism, the writer of Hebrews sought to show how Jesus represented the core of biblical Jewish tradition, even as he transcended it. Our plan is to focus on one chapter each week, discussing where Hebrews makes unique statements in the New Testament, and chatting about how our ancient faith still is miles ahead of us today. Monday Night Group on Zoom Starting September 14th

7:00 pm - "An American Lament" - Discussion Group on Racial Justice and Reconciliation

Join us as we journey together through the 40-day devotional, "An American Lament", a study of racial justice and reconciliation. Each day, you will be drawn into a time of prayer, Scripture reading, reflection, and response led by various Black and white pastors and leaders. Learn more about the history of slavery and Jim Crow in America and the challenges that still exist today in areas such as criminal justice, drug sentencing, housing, education, and health. Consider how God may be calling you to respond both as an individual and as part of the greater Church. Enjoy an opportunity to come together with fellow Christians to hear one another's thoughts and reflections on the readings. This small group opportunity will be offered on Monday nights via Zoom for 8 weeks. Each discussion section will be limited to 10 people. SAFETY AND SECURITY COMMUNICATIONS

UPDATED INFORMATION

Worship Services. Over the past two weeks, the staff, ministry leaders, and many others have been working closely with the Safety & Security team in coordinating implementation efforts related to NPC's approved Plan to Restart Worship Services. Together, we are hopeful that our preparation activities and a continuation of stable health conditions in our local area afford us an opportunity to commence in-person worship services in the fall.

The Worship Committee has been meeting regularly to adapt the services so that safety protocols are met. We are also developing a Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ) document, and will begin sharing with ministry leaders next week with the aim to share and refine this document in the coming weeks with our Congregation to inform you of implementation details as they are finalized.

Next week is the deadline for responding to surveys sent out last week to support our Youth, Children, and Greeter and Usher ministries. If you received a survey, we are relying on your feedback and would greatly appreciate your response by Sunday night Aug. 30. It will take less than 5 minutes and will greatly inform crucial aspects of the NPC implementation plans. We also welcome your questions related to practical issues and hot topics regarding "new" worship service safety measures that will be addressed in the FAQ document noted above. Please submit your worship service questions to Tim Roykouff (troykouff@narberthpres.org). Please pray for NPC's leadership as we continue to make good progress on our preparation activities. Finally, also pray for an outpouring of volunteers to support in-person worship services that hopefully resume in the not-too-distant future.

Small Groups. More group leaders have been scheduling in-person meetings indoors and out. There are now 8 locations available for gathering, with 5 open to all NPC small group leaders (see below) as well as 3 locations for Youth Group, Counseling, and AA groups. Out of love for our neighbor, all NPC gatherings, whether indoors or outdoors, will require mask-wearing, appropriate 6 foot social distancing and frequent hand washing.
