#### Assignment for this week:

- Monday through Friday, read one chapter per day in the Book of Acts.
- Saturday, or any days you are led, meditate more deeply on next week's passage: Acts 2:42-47

## Guidelines for reading Acts:

"The key to your reading of Acts is to recognize the "movement" of the gospel from Jerusalem to Rome, narrated in six parts (panels) and signaled by Luke's little summary statements in 6:7; 9:31; 12:24; 16:5; and 19:20. In each case the narrative seems to pause for a moment before it takes off in a new direction - sometimes geographically, sometimes ethnically, and sometimes both." (Gordon Fee, <u>How To Read The Bible Book By Book</u>).

Luke wants us to read Acts as "a play in which we are invited to become actors ourselves. The stage opens up and we discover we're in the middle of the action. That is part of the point of the "ending", which isn't really an ending: the story continues, and we are part of it." Acts 29! "It is a play in which the only true acting is what happens when the spirit of the playwright himself takes charge." (NT Wright, <u>Bible Study Guide on Acts and Acts For Everyone</u>).

# ACTS 2 Pentecost: Acts 2:1-41

Application Questions – for individuals or small groups:

- Notice the striking manifestations of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost (2:1-8) What do they signify?
- Taking into account the uniqueness of the original Pentecost, what manifestations of the Holy Spirit have you witnessed or experienced?
- What do you consider "normative" for us from this passage? (Notice the reference to "everyone" or "all" in Acts 2:4,17,18,21,38,39.)
- In Acts 2:4 when the early believers were "filled with the Spirit" they spoke in other tongues (known languages), a miracle of communication. What are other biblical marks of being filled with the Spirit? What about your understanding or experience?
- As the Spirit is promised to all who believe, do you think of yourself as a recipient of the Holy Spirit? Is it part of your daily consciousness and identity? What difference would an increased awareness of the Spirit make?
- The Spirit is promised in full measure across the generations (2:17,18). How would you describe your present season of life and how do you see the Spirit at work? How do we, can we, affirm the intergenerational work of the Spirit in church life?
- There are 3 primary reactions in the crowd to the Pentecost event 2:12 "What does this mean?" 2:13 "They're drunk!" (crazy, religious extremists), and 2:37 "What shall we do?" Which response do you most identify with? Which response is most common in our world?
- What do we learn from this passage about the communication of the gospel of Jesus Christ?
