ORDINATION AND INSTALLATION OF ELDERS AND DEACONS

Pastor: Though we have different gifts, together we are a ministry of reconciliation led by the risen Christ. We call people to faith, so that in the end, every knee will bow and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God. Within our common ministry, some members are chosen for particular work as Ministers of the word and sacraments, Elders, or Deacons. In ordination, we recognize these special ministries, remembering that our Lord Jesus said,

<u>People</u>: Whoever among you wants to be great must become the servant of all, and if you want to be first, you must be the slave of all, just as the Son of Man came not to be served, but to serve, and to give his life to set others free.

<u>Pastor</u>: God has called you by the voice of the Church to serve Jesus Christ in a special way. You know who we are and what we believe, and you understand the work for which you have been chosen.

Show your purpose by answering these questions:

Do you trust in Jesus Christ your Savior, acknowledge Him Lord of all and Head of the Church, and through Him believe in one God, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit?

Do you accept the Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments to be, by the Holy Spirit, the unique and authoritative witness to Jesus Christ in the church universal, and God's Word to you?

Do you sincerely receive and adopt the essential tenets of the Reformed Faith as expressed in the confessions of our church as authentic and reliable expositions of what Scripture leads us to believe and do, and will you be instructed and led by those confessions as you lead the people of God?

Will you fulfill your ministry in obedience to Jesus Christ, under the authority of Scripture, and be continually guided by our confessions?

Will you be governed by our church's polity, and will you abide by its discipline? Will you be a friend among your colleagues in ministry, working with them, subject to the ordering of God's Word and Spirit? Will you in your own life seek to follow the Lord Jesus Christ, love your neighbors, and work for the reconciliation of the world?

Do you promise to further the peace, unity, and purity of the church?

Will you pray for and seek to serve the people with energy, intelligence, imagination, and love?

For Elders: Will you be a faithful ruling Elder, watching over the people, providing for their worship, nurture, and service? Will you share in government and discipline, serving in councils of the church, and in your ministry will you try to show the love and justice of Jesus Christ?

For Deacons: Will you be a faithful Deacon, teaching charity, urging concern, and directing the people's help to the friendless and those in need? In your ministry will you try to show the love and justice of Jesus Christ?

For the Congregation: Do we members of the church accept these persons as ruling Elders and Deacons, chosen by God through the voice of this congregation, to lead us in the way of Jesus Christ?

Do we agree to pray for them, to encourage them, to respect their decisions, and to follow as they guide us, serving Jesus Christ, who alone is Head of the Church?


