Over the course of our study we'll consider themes like stillness (like a pond), deeper trust in God's will (much like the current of a river), peace within mystery (as experienced in the depths of the ocean), and being used to bring forth growth in those around us (like the rain). Chaz, his wife Lia, and their three daughters have been worshiping here at Narberth Presbyterian Church for the last two years. Chaz has served for many years as Chaplain at the University of Pennsylvania.
