Church-wide call to pray for June 10th

One of our strengths at NPC is that we are a people eager to pray and longing to follow God's leading. Years of prayer and discerning God's faithful leading have brought us to this time of transition to ECO and church-wide decision on June 10th.

As we anticipate this important day for our church, we long to bathe this time in prayer. Please join us in prayer---upholding our pastors, staff, elders, transition team, and all those in the Presbytery involved in this transition process—that as a church body we might be unified, confident and hope-filled in moving forward to ECO.

Opportunities for gathering in focused prayer are many and will be expanding closer to June 10th: Monday night 7 p.m. in Steve's office, Tuesday morning at 11 a.m. in the parlor, and Sunday morning at 8 a.m. in Steve's office.

A growing number of church members have voiced a burden for intentional, focused prayer in the form of a 24-hour prayer vigil at the church. PRAYER CARDS

Today as you entered the sanctuary, ushers handed out note cards, along with bulletins. If you didn't get one, extra note cards may be found in the pews. We will use these to do a community building exercise in the worship service that is both fun and meaningful. It has two parts:

1. First, if you would be willing to be prayed for every day of this coming week, please write your first and last name on the card. Also, if you would like to receive prayer for a specific request, you may write that on the card as well. This is totally optional. During the offering, you may place your prayer card in the offering plate.

2. Secondly, after the sermon, while we are singing, the offering plates will be passed with all the note cards that have been signed, with names face down in the plates. If you would be willing to pray every day this coming week for the person whose name you "happen" to select, then please take a card. (It is expected that if you would like to be prayed for, you will also take a card to pray for someone in turn).

You may not know the person whose name you select. That's OK! This is part of the fun and the surprise of God's choreography. If you cannot identify your person, Pastors Steve or Debbie or our secretary Karen would be glad to assist you in this "detective" work. We encourage you to wait until next Sunday, May 20, to reveal yourself to the person you've been praying for. You can do this during the Greeting time, or if you do not see them during the service, then perhaps sometime after the service, or during the next week, you can be in touch with them.

We hope this can be an enjoyable spiritual exercise that is both simple and nonthreatening, and that will strengthen our connections with one another in the common bond of Jesus Christ. Who knows what new relationships and answers to prayer may come out of this venture?
