In all his frailty and humanity, Simon Peter is one of us, and also living proof that change is possible. By God's grace, Jesus accepts us as we are, but does not leave us there. Peter eventually became a "rock." Through his brokenness, he was blessed to be a blessing. And so are we.

SERMON NOTES

September 1, 2019 Pastor Steve Weed Identity: How Does Jesus Look At You?

> John 1:29-34 John 1:35-42

Summary and Introduction

Today we begin a new series of messages on spiritual formation, "Called To Flourish: How Christ Is Formed In Us." We will consider the process by which Jesus Christ shaped Simon to become Peter, the "Rock," and how Christ is likewise formed in each one of us. Jesus said, "When a pupil is fully trained, he or she will be like the Master" (Luke 6:40). Today we begin with a message on "Identity: How Jesus Looks At You," because spiritual formation begins with learning to see ourselves as Christ sees us, and finding our identity in him. Christ sees us not only as we are, but as we shall become by his grace. This process of spiritual formation is a dynamic cooperation between God's promise to change us, and our need to actively trust and obey.

A working definition of spiritual formation

"Christian spiritual formation refers to the intentional communal process of growing in our relationship with God and becoming conformed to Christ through the power of the Holy Spirit." (James Wilhoit, <u>Spiritual Formation As If The Church Mattered</u>).
